

WHAT SHOULD WE DO WHEN WE MEET



ACTIVITIES FOR OUTDOOR DATES




Go on a bike ride. If you don't have bikes, you can rent two from a rental shop. If there is no such center nearby, you can borrow them from your friends.

Go to a supermarket, take a shopping cart each, decide on a maximum amount to spend (for example \$10) and head in opposite directions. You have 20 minutes to find a gift for each other.







route

Plan a route through the city, with several steps (riddles, directions, or things to do) from your partner's home to your meeting point. After going through all the stages, when they reach you at the meeting spot, offer them flowers or eat something yummy together.









Fill their room with little notes containing beautiful messages of appreciation and love. Use colorful paper for an even more successful surprise.





dice

Get a die and roll it, every morning. Each side should have a different task, such as:

#1 – send me a picture of yourself!

#2 – today, send me messages every hour about what you're doing and how you're feeling!

#3 – prepare a gift for me!

And so on. For each side, you can agree on a specific task.






city tour

Go on a tour of the city by bus or on foot, pretending you are tourists. This can help you learn more about the city you live in, and it's a great opportunity to share stories and memories of different neighborhoods.

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story
